The October/ November Night Sky

October

10th – New Moon

9th- 13th - Venus, Saturn & Regulus appear closest together in morning sky

21th - Peak of the Orionid meteors

26th - Moon is closest to Earth and thus the largest full moon for 2007

November

3rd - Moon occults Regulus about 3:40 am

9th - New Moon

18th –Peak of the Leonid meteors

26th – Moon passes 1.5 degrees north of Mars (9:30 PST)

December – Mars reaches opposition and be at its closest approach for the next 9 years
